# This Term In Room 3

Hello Families,

Room 3 has had a wonderful start to the year with many adventures in their learning journey. We began the year with learning how we can be Faith filled, Respectful and Resilient learners. We discussed what this looked, sounded and felt like. We have, and will continue to, revisit these values as we continue our year.

We have seen some beautiful writing in our 1/2 class, writing responses to our favourite weather and why we chose that weather. Students enjoyed writing about what they would do if they were Principal for a day – Mrs Hartmann said her first task would be to allow teachers to wear pyjamas every day!

Room 3 are wonderful mathematicians, learning how to read, recognise and write large numbers. They have shown great interest in exploring hands-on activities, playing games with their peers and challenging one another in number tasks.



One of our favourite parts of the room is the Inquiry section. This has allowed students to further explore our focused learning areas this term of weather and space. They have learned the purpose of a telescope, and understood why it is important to know the weather ahead so that they may dress accordingly- a task that is much easier in Darwin.

Finally and most importantly, we have been spending time in our classroom praying together. We are learning to be faith filled in our interactions with one another, and have learned that a Sacred Heart community member shows grace, mercy, and compassion. # This Term In Room 1

We have had a busy start to the year in Room 1. We are continuing to focus on our classroom learning expectations and routines. We have been learning what it is to be a good friend and ways we can learn to develop a positive growth mindset. We have an affirmation station set up in our inquiry space and will continue to work on this throughout the year.



Last week, we attended our Ash Wednesday Mass in the church. Students were reverent and respectful during our Whole School Mass. In Religion, we have made our Lenten promises and discussed how we will continue to follow in the footsteps of Jesus during the forty days of Lent.









In English, we have been focusing on recount writing. Students are learning the recount process of the – Who, What, When, Where and Why. We have loved building words and writing sentences during our small group Literacy activities.

In Science, we have been exploring different weather patterns. Students have enjoyed learning and exploring in our inquiry learning space. We talked about the two seasons in Darwin (Wet and Dry season). We had some great wonders. I wonder... Why does it not snow in Darwin?

In Maths, we have been focusing on numbers up to 120. Students have been working on addition number strategies and Friends of 10.



In week 1 we have been getting to know each other, sharing fun facts and stories with our classmates, and completing activities such as 'A Letter to my teacher' and creating Math about ME posters. During our time with Ms Chessell, we also created our self-portraits with pastels, inspired by artist Sandra Silberzweig.













In Maths we have been focusing on Odd and Even numbers and Measurement – Length. Here you can see us measuring our bodies, using different measuring tools to get the

measurements.

In Religion we have begun our preparation for Easter with the commencement of Lent last Wednesday. Some examples of how we can follow in the footsteps of Jesus are helping those in need, listening to our parents, being kind to our siblings and praying every day.

This year the students of SHCPS are learning Auslan, the Australian Sign language. We have a lesson each week with Miss Tandy. We have been learning to sign our names, greet our teachers and each other. Here are some examples of signing our names.









In Literacy we have been focusing on Persuasive texts. We have created fun and colourful advertisements of our favourite food, drink or sport. We have also been writing about what animals make the best pets and which season is the best in the NT. In Room 7 we mostly agree that the wet season is the best season because the rain is refreshing and cool and is fun to play in. Jack says we have the best weather in all of Australia!



The start of the 2024 school year in 5/6, has been dedicated to friendships, leadership and getting to know the routines.

Students have been learning about what it means to be a leader at Sacred Heart and all the responsibilities that come with it. In our Whole School Opening Mass, Father Tom presented the leaders with their badges and gave them all a blessing.

Our families joined us for a special BBQ lunch, we hope they can continue to build our school community and join us for other special events throughout the year!





For sustainability this term, children helped to make the first of our portable, recycled garden beds. These were made from pallets and have wheels so that Educators can move them to areas that suit the plants the best. The children can then use the food grown in their cooking activities and kitchen skills. There were many conversations about safety, how to use each tool and also what we will be planting. We hope that Bunnings will help us to plant seedlings early next term.





We also began our new scrap bucket project by delivering buckets to all classrooms. The children will then help to sort the scraps for either the chickens and worms or for the compost which will later go back into the school grounds to keep the garden healthy.

Our kitchen skills program also continued, children have been learning how to use butter knives while spreading butter on bread as well as making mini pizza. 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#### TRANSITION/ ONE

Our young explorers have embarked on a digital adventure! They've explored train tracks, loops, and action bricks. Through play, they're building early math skills, problem-solving abilities, and collaboration.

Grade One/Two students are discovering various computer types, moving beyond laptops and desktops. They had fun creating their own computer designs within specific criteria. Soon, they'll build models of their designs, enhancing their tech understanding and sparking creativity. Exciting creations are coming your way!

# This Term with APRE




